

Some facts about the Native American Tribes



The Chickasaw Nation occupied original homelands in the states of Mississippi, Kentucky, Tennessee and Alabama.



The transportation of Native American Indian and Chickasaw Tribes



Canoes is the form of transportation used by Native American and chickasaws tribes living near rivers, lakes and oceans. The construction and style of canoe varies from region to region, but is most often dugout and bark styles. Indians built these birch-bark canoes by trial and error. Once they discovered a working form of the boat, it has not been improved much. Today canoes look very similar to the original Native American and chickasaws canoes!!

Fact: The Chickasaw Indians originally lived in the Southeast in areas of Mississippi, Alabama, Tennessee, and Kentucky. In 1832 they migrated to Oklahoma after being forced to sell their land to the United States government. The Chickasaw were known as some of the fiercest warriors in all of the Americas and earned the nickname as the "Spartans of the Lower Mississippi Valley."
